Dear Friends,

In the church's calendar, the time between Pentecost (which passed in mid-June) and Advent (beginning mid-November) is called “Ordinary Time”. I have always found this a strange term to use. Some times and seasons are extraordinary in and of themselves and others are not.

There are obvious seasons in life that are far from anything we might call ordinary. The grief following a death, the time before, around and after the birth of a child or the journey through engagement towards marriage and beyond are all extraordinary times, containing many surprises and hidden corners around which we must turn. We could name many others across our personal and community life, I am sure. I know I could.

We also live in a culture that is good at hyping our daily experience. The more loud, rapid or sophisticated things are made to be, the more extraordinary they are proclaimed to be. The television content aimed at children is a window into a frenetic culture constantly re-inventing itself, often using gimmick after gimmick.

Meaningful faith embraces ordinariness. By “meaningful” I mean something that is not compartmentalised into “sacred” or “secular” experiences or activities. It is a lived orientation to the possibility of encounter with God in each and any circumstance. In fact, the true experience of the vast majority of those we call saints, ancient or modern, is of life lived intentionally in the ordinariness of it all. We make much of their ecstatic moments, and often very little of their daily faithfulness.

“Ordinary Time” suggests to me that we expect it to be so. It remains possible - indeed, it remains the task of faith - to live with an openness to this moment that we are in, which may pass by in a blaze of the unspectacular, or which may genuinely surprise us, and do so without us hyping it into something that it is not. However ordinary or extraordinary your life is right now, and in whatever direction, may you and I embrace the journey.
