Dear friends,

My son Matthew had his birthday yesterday.

We gave him a scooter.

On the scooter was an unmissable red and black label that read
 "Warning! This product moves when used".

You couldn't make it up, could you?!

Someone got paid for coming up with that after someone else got paid for
 thinking it was necessary. I take my hat off to the person who invented
 the scooter in the first place.

Matthew got from his godparents the requisite pads for elbows, knees and
 wrists, which he was unwilling to take off, even when some distance from
 the scooter. He spends quite a bit of his time collecting scrapes and holes
 in his trousers. The pads are declared "cool". Today he banged his head
 at school and will sport an impressive bruise for some days to come.

I'm not going to bang on about a compensation culture or health and
 safety legislation implementation gone mad. It's all too easy to hold
 opinions about the way that others deal with risk themselves or on behalf
 of us all.

I'd rather ask a question.

What risks are worth taking, even necessary?

Today I sat with someone I'd never met before, and our conversation
 wandered into very personal territory. I had a choice to make, one I
 regularly have to make. How much of myself should I bring into this
 conversation? It's not a question about ego. It's about how much of my
 own humanity and vulnerability belongs in this moment in a way that might
 be good for this person I'm talking with. It's a choice I make regularly, and
 it's one of the reasons I love doing what I do.

Matthew, aged 6, just is who he is. He hides nothing yet. He challenges
 me to keep asking what I have to hide, moment by moment, person by
 person.

I like to think I'm on the whole wisely judicious when it comes to risking
 myself. I find, more often than not, that it enhances and furthers most
 relationships or interactions I have.

What risks do you find worth taking, even necessary?
