Dear friends,

Henri Nouwen wrote a book that I read early on in my training as a Methodist minister. It's called "The Living Reminder".

Ministers and priests aren't meant to be the public vanguards or defenders of a particular morality, or pray and act, inside and outside the church, because they are better at either than anyone else would be. Our job is to be a living reminder of what it means to put at the centre of all things the life and invitations of God shown most profoundly through Jesus.

Our work is to be alongside people as they examine their assumptions, work at their relationships with God, themselves and others, explore their potential and serve others. Often that means listening to their stories, having time to do so, and arranging the church's life in such a way that people feel that their stories are part of a larger and shared story.

There's a particular chapter in the book that talks about "Creative Absence". It reminds ministers and priests that they sometimes have to get out of the way in order that people's stories unfold creatively. Leaving and the manner of our leaving can be as important as arriving, in every visit or conversation, and even in moving on from a post. Creative absence requires wisdom, humility, and creativity.

Nancy felt that it was time for her to be creatively absent. She retired just over a year ago. In the meantime, the church has continued to move forward, people have surprised themselves as they have taken up new responsibilities, and the Anglican wisdom of leaving space between a leaving and an arriving has borne fruit.

On the 14th February, at 7.30pm, Rev Johannes Nobel becomes the new Vicar of Heslington. I look forward to his friendship and collegueship, and getting to know Jan, his wife Majimcha and their young son, Evan.

I loved working with Nancy. I am very confident the same will be true of Jan.

Please do come to his Collation that evening.  
As always, all are welcome.

Jan will be writing next month's letter, as newly appointed Vicar.
