Dear Friends,

Browsing in a second hand bookstore, I came across a beautifully illustrated 8-volume bird guide, first published in 1850 by a certain Revd. F.O. Morris. I couldn't help but feel a little jealous. Where did he find the time? Later I read the following in Michael Walters' *A Concise History of Ornithology*: 'In Britain, clergymen were in the forefront [...] The system of church patronage allowed appreciable time for the incumbent to follow hobbies and interests, such as ornithology.' If only I were born two centuries ago!

Some of you may know that I am a keen birdwatcher. Jesus said: 'Consider the birds', and I take that quite literally. You might have seen me walking down the street carrying binoculars. Heslington is blessed with a range of excellent habitats, from the wonderfully green gardens of the old village to the newly developed lake behind Heslington East.

In recent years, ornithologists have made a series of breakthrough discoveries about birds. For centuries we have underestimated what goes on in a bird's head. For instance, until recently scientists wrongly assumed (or worse, observed) that birds have a poor sense of smell. In fact, this sense is highly developed in most species. It is disturbingly easy to be completely wrong!

I think this is true for the world of science as much as for the world of arts. I wonder: When in 50 years' time a future generation looks back at us and the way we live our lives, what will they think? What are the wrong assumptions (or 'observations') we make?

Thankfully, some things stand the test of time, transcending our human frailty in ways that are beyond us. Thank God that there is still a sacred space in Heslington in which to humbly contemplate the mysteries of the eternal. I have been told a church has stood in this village since the 11th century. I think it might still be there in 50 years' time. And for good reasons!
