## Badger Hill Residents Community Group (BHRCG)

At the AGM the audited accounts were approved and a committee elected for the year 2012-13. However, a secretary is still required; a position which must be filled if the group is to retain its effectiveness. Many concerns were expressed about the on-street parking which has been displaced from the southern edge of Badger Hill to the interior of the estate. A petition is being organised from residents in those parts of Zone 9 not covered by the traffic regulation order, i.e. Deramore Drive, Yarburgh Way, Badger Wood Walk (North), Pinewood Hill, Foxthorn Paddock and Hesketh Bank. Residents from these streets are also advised to write individual letters requesting the extension of the traffic regulation order to the whole of Zone 9. Address these to Stephen Hockley, Traffic Technician, City of York Council, 9 St Leonard's, York, YO1 7ET. Consultation is taking place on the proposed policy for the introduction of an A4D for York. The papers can be seen at [www.york.gov.uk/LDF/SPD](http://www.york.gov.uk/LDF/SPD) or by calling 551482. When completing the survey it is worth bearing in mind that BHRCG considers a lower tipping point of 10% to be preferable to the 20% quoted and recommends the introduction of a compulsory registration scheme for all HMOs rather than a voluntary scheme. Dear Friends,

When I write this, Heslington is covered with a layer of snow. Spring seems a long way off. But underneath the white blanket life is stirring. Just before the snow hid them, I saw the daffodils around the church. There are hundreds of them – all ready to transform the church yard into a sea of green and yellow.

Or so we assume.

In *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*, C.S. Lewis described a fantasy world where it was 'forever winter, and never Christmas'. Can you imagine what that would be like? No daffodils. No bumble bees. No birdsong. No smell of freshly mowed lawns.

There are some things we know, (i.e. that there are daffodils under the snow) and some things we assume (i.e. that these daffodils will soon burst into bloom).

The evil witch in the aforementioned book *assumed* she won the battle when she killed Aslan the lion. But Aslan *knew* a 'deeper magic', a power which brought life out of death.

At the approach of spring in the Northern Hemisphere, the church engages in a time of sombre reflection on the last days of Jesus' life. We do so with the benefit of hindsight. We know that underneath the darkness of Jesus' final suffering a 'deeper magic' is stirring. We know that through his final act of sacrificial love he gained victory over the powers of darkness.

As freshly appointed Vicar of Heslington church, I am looking forward to explore with you what it means that Jesus is alive today, here and now. I don't have all the answers. There are some things I know, and some things I assume. But I am ever inquisitive about this 'deeper magic' which has the power to transform our lives, the life of our community and the life of the world.
