Dear Friends,

Over the last two months I have had two conversations with people who experienced the loss of a child. Being a father myself, the very idea of losing a child sends shivers down my spine. It is simply unimaginable.

Whenever a loved one dies, we are brought face to face with our mortality. Until then, we live happily in the expectation of long and healthy lives. But when death's dark shadow falls across our path, and we are forced to contemplate these things, we realise that we have no guarantee whatsoever that our own death isn't just around the corner. Not a very uplifting thought? Interestingly, accepting our own fragility may lead us to a deeper insight into the precious beauty of our lives. This process is often observed in people who recover from life threatening illnesses: They develop a new and deeper appreciation for the things that really matter in life.

The psychotherapist Irvin D. Yalom says that 'the physicality of death destroys us, but the idea of death saves us' (*Staring At The Sun. Being at peace with your own mortality: Overcoming the Terror of Death*, 2008). The Bible goes even further: Even the physicality of death can lead to new life. Jesus said, 'Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds.' He referred to his own death and resurrection, and invited us to share with him in that most costly process of renewal.

How? How will we take part in the mystery of God's victory over death? Let's simply start by living every day as if it were our last, in full enjoyment and thankful celebration of every blessing we receive.
