Dear Friends,

A UNICEF study from 2007 placed the UK at the bottom of the child well-being league table among 21 developed countries. The top spot was taken by The Netherlands. Having lived in both countries, I sometimes wonder about the reasons behind this difference. Sure enough, in my experience The Netherlands is a great place to grow up. It seems safer and much more laid-back for children. Education is excellent. Common sense prevails over rules and regulations. And you never get knocked off your bike on your way to school.

But as the father of a lovely two year old I strongly believe that child well-being starts at home, wherever on the planet that may be.

In Heslington we are blessed to have two excellent primary schools and an outstanding secondary school within our parish boundaries. There are clubs and activities for children of all age groups: Song Box, toddler groups, pre-schools, after-school clubs, Brownies, Scouts, the Youth Club run by church – too many to mention. Many of these schools and groups are linked with the Church in some way. I am the Chaplain of Archbishop Holgate's School and have recently started to help with assemblies at one of the local primary schools. Several times a year the uniformed organisations visit church for their parade services. Other groups use the church as a venue for their activities.

We believe in children. They are not just the future, they are the present, an essential part of our community of all ages. So we are excited about our refurbished children's room, which will be dedicated on the first Sunday of November at 10am. If you are (grand)parents or carers of a young child, you are warmly invited to join us for a party and special celebration of the gift of children. We really hope to see you there.
