Dear Friends,

And so, the Olympics and Paralympics are over. I for one was a bit bereft for a while. No one doubts that they were a success, but the conversation about whether they were worth the money continues. Their legacy remains undecided in the long term, but the euphoria has hopefully reshaped our openness and community-mindedness a little, or a lot, and if that lasts, if a healthy pride remains, we will all be the better for it.

A few nights ago on Dragon's Den, a couple made a pitch for finance for an idea that had more to do with values than sheer profit. They were going to make money, in fact they already had, but they weren't going to make as much as possible because their business was based on a value alongside a service. One of the dragons just couldn't grasp that.

So how do we measure the value of something, of anything really? What values do we apply? What or who comes first? At the beginning of the first year of a new fees regime, what makes a university degree worth the now whopping sums of money that a graduate will pay back, however gently and fairly that payment occurs?

My children were enthralled by the Olympics. My son's recent 7<sup>th</sup> birthday party had an Olympic theme. My daughter re-enacted a number of scenes in Playmobil. I sent a picture of one, without her knowing, to the gold medallist specifically depicted, and she got a long, humble, grateful letter in reply. I can't say that the look on Hannah's face when she read it was worth billions of pounds, but it was priceless. I am grateful to Katherine Grainger, an exceptional Olympian and woman, for the time she took to write. Her letter may well become a marker in Hannah's life.

It seems to me that the answer to the question of what makes life, something, someone, valuable, lies more in the little things than the large. The Olympics and Paralympics came and went on a grand scale. We cannot recreate the scale of them, or the focus of their impact, but we can all on a daily basis in the little things we all take part in bring value, opportunity, openness, enthusiasm, generosity, trust and a willingness to risk. I have received those enough times from others to know that they are worth offering in return.
