Dear Friends,

Something incredible happened last month. The Queen jumped from a helicopter, live on television. Even more incredibly, the British people suddenly felt much happier about the way their tax money was spent. *Isles of Wonder!*

Danny Boyle directed an Olympic opening ceremony that was inspiring, uplifting, and emotionally touching. It all began with that famous hymn 'Jerusalem' (*And did the Countenance Divine / Shine forth upon our clouded hills? / And was Jerusalem builded here / Among these dark Satanic Mills?*). According to Danny Boyle himself, 'woven through [the ceremony], there runs a golden thread of purpose – the idea of Jerusalem [...] A belief that we can build Jerusalem. And that it will be for everyone.'

I must confess that I very much like the newfound optimism that has spread over the country, but I am concerned that we will struggle to build Jerusalem in England's Green and Pleasant Land if we don't share some kind of blueprint to 'fix our eyes on'.

Some 2000 years ago St Paul attended the games in their original context in ancient Greece. He too felt inspired. Having observed the great commitment of the running athletes he wrote to the church: *Let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus.* (Hebrews 12: 2)

If St Paul were alive today, he would probably comment that we need more than a positive spirit to build a strong society. Nevertheless, it's always better to focus on what we share in common rather than what divides us. Danny Boyle taught us that we all share our history and heritage. Jesus teaches us how we may all share the future as well.
