Dear Friends,

I read last month's clergy letter before it was printed and I was happy for it to be published. Not because I agreed with every word, but because I believe we don't always have to agree. It's nice if we do, but even if we don't, we can still live in love and unity. We are united by something much greater than a set of matching opinions. Our differences may sometimes make us feel a bit uncomfortable, but in the end this is far better than being theologically monomorphic.

I have been the vicar of Heslington for just over a year now. So far I have greatly enjoyed being here, and I continue to feel more and more at home. One of my only frustrations is that I still haven't met many of you, both within the church community and within the wider community of Heslington parish.
