Dear Friends,

By the time you read this, the university year, for most undergraduates at least, will be over. For some it will mark the end of their time here in York and as part of our wider community. It's a time that holds mixed feelings for everyone, in and outside of the university.

A recent community survey by the Students Union produced around 900 written responses. The results made for interesting and in some ways sad reading.

Only 22% of those who responded out of the wider community stated that they had introduced themselves to student neighbours and said hello. An even smaller percentage of student responders had done the same.

I wonder what that says about British culture, local culture, or neighbourliness more generally? Surely more could come of our living together as a mixed and interesting community if we all knew each others' names at least? It would make any conversations that followed about the practical outworking of living alongside each other much easier.

I have once more had really good student neighbours. I put out their bins sometimes, they take all my parcels, we chat when we pass on the verge, and I've got to know some of their parents too. They have the very best kind of landlord, and I've got to know him in much the same way, which he has appreciated. It hasn't cost me much, except a deliberate and friendly welcome when they moved in, time every now and then to ask how they are, and a large cake for taking all the parcels.

I for one look forward to greeting new neighbours in a few months' time. I hope you're one of those who will join me in that.

It's good for all of us, and I like to take the initiative in things that are good for us, even if the response is not guaranteed. In my case it has always come back with interest. If that welcome and interest forms part of a happy or at least grateful remembering of these years once they have graduated, I'm glad to have been part of shaping those memories, and having mine shaped very positively at the same time.

Whatever your own experience, we all get to choose again in a few short months how we will live together for the next year in this corner of York.
