Dear Friends,

Lang leve de koning! As some of you know, I am Dutch, and I've got a brand new king! Queen Beatrix 'retired' at the end of April, and her son Willem-Alexander was crowned King of The Netherlands in her place. The ceremony cost the tax payer the equivalent of 10 million pounds, which came as no surprise to those who know that the Dutch monarchy is the most expensive one in Europe. What is perhaps more surprising is that the great majority of Dutch people thought it was money well spent!

Someone once said that the true value of money is entirely dependent on what it is spent on.

As some of you know, Heslington Church faces a major fund raising challenge. In the next five years, we need to have roof works done which may cost us over £100,000. Of course we haven't got that kind of money. It will take a tremendous effort to raise it. But even if we manage it, there is still the question about how this money is best spent. £100,000 could pay for a fulltime youth & community worker for the next eight years. Or we could fix the roof. What would you prefer? What would be right?

The question needs to be answered, 'Is Heslington Church is worth fighting for and why?' Only when we know and understand our vision, purpose and function in this place can we decide on how to spend our resources wisely.

Perhaps our church is a bit like the Dutch monarchy. Expensive to some, but simply priceless to others. However, whereas we can quite safely assume the Dutch monarchy will be unaffected by any of our choices, Heslington Church may need your active support to survive! I hope you feel it's worth it.
