Dear Friends,

We had our church's Annual General Meeting recently. We had the meeting on a Sunday morning as part of our morning service. We sang, read, voted, listened, discussed and looked forward together, and ended the service with a simple holy communion, and a bring and share lunch.

It was a good day. We mixed a lot of practical and organisational decision-making with formal and informal parts of a regular service of worship. That felt right. Too often we separate things that we think are sacred, or belong in particular religious settings, from things we regard as everyday.

Jan and I have been talking together a lot lately. He has been here over a year now, and we are in a good place to explore plans and hopes that we share for the church and the wider community. Central to those hopes, and the energy we want to give to them, is the desire to create opportunities for us to build our relationships with each other, to build community in every way that we can. We're not saying that "community" doesn't exist. By no means! But we want to give more energy and time to offering opportunities out of the church's life for that to happen more, and more richly.

We're going to move from two Sunday services to a single service at 10am, probably from the 2nd June. We believe that will help us all in the church community to get to know each other better, and focus our Sunday mornings more. Those at the AGM who have given us feedback have said the same. It feels like a good move.


Acts of worship on Sunday mornings are only part of what any faith community's life should be about. What more could we do? What could we do for you? What do you think we and the church could helpfully offer or arrange to or for the wider community? Let us know. We'd love to hear.
