Dear Friends,

A while ago Bishop Martin Wallace spent a good evening with us in a "Grill the Bishop" Q&A session, reflecting on his experiences and opinions as he approaches retirement. It was full of fascinating and challenging insights, and one of his comments resonated with me enormously. He said that the religious Jewish community have the right approach to "Sabbath". They have their religious service the evening before the day, so that the whole day is free and unconstrained for relationship, rest, play and reflection.

Our Sunday service cuts right across the one really uncluttered day in a lot of people's lives, and I have lots of sympathy for all who have told me that they struggle both ways, either because they come to church and therefore sacrifice other creative opportunities, or because they would like to come to church but find that their "Sabbath" is more precious in other directions.

Opinions will of course abound about the meaning and significance of "Sabbath", and where a service of worship fits into that day's rhythm.

Jan and I are keen to continue exploring church beyond Sunday in all the forms that it can take. It does exist in all kinds of forms in Heslington already, but Bishop Martin's challenge was to put Sunday and participation in the church community in context, and think outside the box of Sunday worship as much as we can. I like that challenge.

If you were to spend part of your week as part of the church community, in worship or conversation or practical action as an individual or with loved ones, what would you like to do, and when would you like to do it?

We'd love to hear your answers! All suggestions are welcome. Please let us know by whatever means you have. Sunday worship will always be there, but it's only one expression of church and community. Let's add a few more.
