Dear Friends,

This weekend has been unnaturally sunny and warm, by British standards. We all had an ice cream on Saturday. We fired up the barbeque in the evening. On Sunday we went on a trip to the coast. When we came back, we didn't feel like cooking, so we went to the local pub, where we treated ourselves to a lovely three course meal on the terrace.

Earlier this week I watched a BBC documentary on UK food poverty. All of the people featured in the program had a food budget of around two pounds per person per day, and one pensioner had even less than two pounds a day to spend. It was heart-breaking.

The amount of money my family spent on food over the last two days equals twice the monthly budget of the pensioner I watched on TV. Yet, for all I know, he lives just around the corner. Did you know that the York Foodbank has opened two new locations to cope with recent demands?

Also, did you know that according to the 2010 Index of Multiple Deprivation (which takes into account statistics of income, employment, health, education, housing, crime and living environment), Heslington parish is the least deprived area of the City of York? In fact, we are ranked among the most affluent parishes in the whole of Yorkshire.

Perhaps we need reminding of how fortunate we are. Jesus told us on numerous occasions that great fortunes come with equally great responsibilities. The greater our blessings, the greater our duty to share with those less fortunate.
