Dear Friends,

I googled my own name yesterday, just to check. Jan Nobel. Nothing incriminating turned up. Johannes Nobel. Again, nothing. Father Jan. Nada. But I found out that there is an Fr Jan Community School in Alberta, Canada. What is even better, related to the school is a Friends of Fr Jan Society. I am very tempted to ask them for a holiday grant.

I expect you will have heard the news about the 'right to be forgotten'. A European court ruled that all people should have the opportunity to ask Google to remove any search results leading to information about them that appeared to be inadequate, irrelevant or no longer relevant.

However, who will decide if those conditions apply? It is highly unlikely that Google will start its own detective agency to judge between individual cases. In reality, this ruling quite simply means that anyone, for any reason, can ask for any information to be removed from the Google search engine. Which is a bit unfair on Google in the first place, because they are not responsible for the content of the websites they link to. Don't shoot the messenger.

But there are more serious objections to this so-called right to be forgotten. Whereas many people think that to forgive is to forget, those who have the authority to speak on the subject tend to disagree. Archbishop Desmond Tutu says: 'Forgiving is not forgetting; it's actually remembering - remembering and not using your right to hit back. It's a second chance for a new beginning. And the remembering part is particularly important. Especially if you don't want to repeat what happened.'

The miracle of love and forgiveness is that they triumph despite everything we know about each other.
