Dear friends,

As I type these words, friends, colleagues and millions of others are voting in South Africa's 5<sup>th</sup> democratic elections. Many of them were not even conceived when we all stood in queues for the first time in 1994, on the brink of national disaster or new birth.

Hopefulness and maturity prevailed, and the country stutters on into a future very different from its past, or from some of the possibilities that were there 20 years ago. Though York and the UK are home now, I watch with interest from afar, and try to get behind and beyond the loudest voices in it all, voices which usually want ever more vocally to find fault and reason to complain.

Some of the wealthiest people I know have been complaining on Facebook about having to queue for longer than they expected to cast their votes. Others celebrate with pride all that it means to be taking part in a robust and emerging democracy that is still very dysfunctional but emerging, however slowly.

It's such an obvious thing.

We usually find what we're looking for. We see the world through the lenses we have in part been given, in part chosen, and certainly accepted and nurtured over many years.

I am not naïve, nor are my lenses rose-tinted, but I'm learning to make room consistently for the possibility that my interpretation of events, or of a person's behaviour, or my or their expectations, may be misplaced or just plain wrong. Maybe that person who just cut me off in the traffic is on the way to hospital or has received some other urgent news. Maybe that person's apparent rudeness or self-centredness is a mask hiding real fear, or is the mark of a person on the very edge of feeling unable to cope with whatever life is throwing at them right now. Add your own examples, however begrudgingly.

Compassion, humility and making room for unknown possibilities feature large on my learning curve right now. However steep or gentle, I believe these are an essential part of a creative life, and for everyone's sake.
