Dear Friends,

I've returned recently from our annual Methodist Conference. I go as a delegate from our District Synod, and the Conference meets for a week each year to discuss, to deliberate and to decide on our direction of travel. Some of it is dynamic and inspiring, other parts are (for me) more tedious but absolutely necessary for due diligence, reporting and accounting.

The Church of England's General Synod have also recently met again in York, and their agenda was a similar mixture of things.

The Chancellor has unveiled a further budget full of cuts and apparent efficiency savings, and we wait to see what effect they have, and to whose benefit.

The university continues with a new university strategy in a challenging market, and re-organisation is an ongoing theme in many parts of it.

Decisions made on a large scale over a distance can sometimes be exciting moments to be a part of, but that excitement is illusory in many ways. For every feeling I had during our Conference, thousands of Methodists that I was representing were going about their everyday lives, living in their local communities and getting on with building and maintaining, however large or small, a substantial expression of community and hope "on the ground".

Who we are together is up to us.

I've been reminded of that again, both here and at a distance. Decisions made about us and the organisation of our life together matter, of course, but the quality of our community, church, neighbourhood, and neighbourliness is of our choosing. No vote or policy dictates these things.
