Dear friends,

The elections are over, and the next five years lie brightly or darkly before us, depending on our individual and/or collective sentiments.

The result surprised many, and the conversations that followed in the media about the accuracy of the polls and prediction tools left me scratching my head. I know that there was good mathematical modelling to the predictions made, but the fact seems to be that lots of people on all sides arrived in the moment of voting and chose there and then. No amount of hand-wringing inquiry into the forecasting can change the fact that we choose, often in the moment, what we value, what and whom we trust, where our priorities lie, and, in the sum of those and other choices, who we fundamentally are in that moment.

It's an obvious point, but worth making in a culture that has strong strands of blaming and the apparent handing over of personal responsibility woven through it. Whatever the next five years holds for us, and however we each feel about it, each of us will continue to decide moment by moment who we are, what we do, what we value, how we respond to circumstances or people, how we deal with strong emotion, where generosity and community-mindedness fit into our wallets, our diaries and our attention. No government can make us better people. No political system or structure ultimately chooses for us who we are as human beings.

Wherever and with whatever convictions we placed our crosses on ballot papers, today and every day ask us who we are, and we will choose, again and again. I hope that together we can be wise, compassionate and strong in equal measure.
