Dear Friends,

At the start of September, I stood on the harbour in Kos town, looking across the sea to Bodrum, near enough that the buildings were individually visible. Several fast tourist boats were about to depart for a day's shopping in the Turkish town, while, alongside their moorings, a number of half-inflated boats that had carried refugees were loosely tied together. I've stood on battlefield sites and tried to picture the horror. This was very immediate, with the images of a three year old boy lying on a beach just a short distance away travelling the world and shaking us to the core.

In the town, I watched a dignified refugee family sweep the pavement outside their makeshift tent, awaiting transport to be "processed" into Europe in Athens. Many others shared hesitant smiles, and it seemed that the town and island's people were offering pragmatic, compassionate and generous support in every way that they could. It wasn't easy, but they were getting on with it in the face of human need.

"Welcome" is so important, however complex the situation.

York is not Kos, and our lives are almost entirely untouched by those events, though of course there are many in the university's life who are directly affected by the plight of family members in war zones, or suffering ethnic or religious persecution.

"Welcome" is ours to offer in this neck of the woods. Over 400,000 people enter British universities as undergraduates in these few weeks. They come to live among us, from around the corner and around the world. Living on campus or off-campus, let's offer a smile at least, a warm greeting, any help we can. Everyone's name and story matters, and who knows what gift you may receive, as you give the gift of welcome.
