The builders are in! The old choir stalls have gone, the new cupboards for the tower room have been measured up, and a set of glass doors has been ordered for the inner porch. Soon we will be able to enter the church through the original Victorian entrance as well as through the modern doors behind the tower. The change won't be anything as dramatic as when the church was last reordered in the early 70's, but it's still exciting.

After the last reordering, the old Victorian entrance (on the village side of the church) fell out of use, and the modern entrance (facing the university) became the main entrance. Rumour had it that the church closed its doors to the village and opened them to the university. That wasn't the case, but to set the record straight and make our intention clear, our doors will soon be open in both directions: the village and the university. We really hope and pray that all feel welcome. Do come and have a look when the work is finished!

Buildings are important. They can be vaults of memories. If stones could talk, they would tell the stories of generations. That's why we care about the fabric of church. However, our patron saint St Paul described the church as 'a temple made of living stones'. In its essence, the church/mosque/temple is not about the fabric and its rich history, but about the people who meet there now.

Our doors are wide open. Perhaps we need to let go of some memories, and create some new and better ones together. Let's knock down the walls that we have raised between us, and built a place where all are welcome and loved through the same Love.
