Dear friends,

It's been a tough year for many in the life of the university. We've had a disproportionate number of student deaths, and that has taken its toll on many people inside and outside of the university, near and far. People are often surprised that student deaths occur, but the truth is that across a population of 15,000 mostly young people, the weight of statistical evidence means it will happen, and does.

I have conducted two funerals for students this academic year. Both were the result of suicide. There are few more tragic moments to share in, and they affect me alongside everyone else who shares them. I remain in touch with the families of a number of young people who have taken their own lives in recent years, and they limp on with their memories and lingering questions.

We're in the season of Lent. I have listened to people talk about things, treats or activities they will "give up" for this forty day period. The wisdom of a Lenten discipline is to disrupt the usual pattern of our lives, and then see what emerges. Especially, to remove some of our best tricks and tools that distract or hide us from life as it is, and then face ourselves afresh.

I have been learning the need over some time to give up trying to be stronger than I am, and both ask for and receive help more than I have been willing to do or honest enough to admit needing, especially in the form of good and intentional conversation about my life, how I feel, and where I'm struggling. Perhaps you also could give up the need to appear stronger than you are, and find a gentle and wise listener, amongst other things.

Death and resurrection are always around us, in little and large ways. That is our particular season in the church at this time, and with it, particular invitations, gifts and graces.
