I am a golfer.

You're either suddenly interested in what comes next, or sighing and about to
turn the page. There's not much ground in the middle. Read on!

I used to play a lot, but stopped about 20 years ago. My son Matthew and I
have picked up the game together in the last 18 months, and I've been
surprised at how well I've got my groove back, and with a lot more maturity
and realism. It's fun, frustrating, social and engaging.

There is a great democratic truth in golf, that on any given hole any golfer
may play a shot that any star-studded professional would be glad to have
played in that moment. It can be glorious. The next shot is usually less so...

Jesus is recorded as saying, "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect."
Quite a tall order, and we're all amateurs in that game.

John Wesley, founder of the Methodist movement, developed a doctrine of
"Christian Perfection" out of these words. It's complicated, and full of
qualifications, but essentially states that any of us can offer perfect love into
any given moment, and act or speak or think or behave in a way that reveals
or expresses the whole heart of God.

I know I've been on the receiving end of some of those moments in the lives
of others, and I hope that others can say the same about me. There is a
corollary to this, though. As soon as you yourself think you're doing it, you
almost definitely aren't!

Perfect golf shots are of no real consequence, but perfect love can leave
things changed forever. I hope you've received some of that in your life, and
believe you have it within you as well, to give to others, even yourself.
