Dear friends,

I was having a conversation with a visitor recently after a Sunday service,
this person having come reluctantly with family they were visiting.
They expressed surprise at having actually quite enjoyed it, and that it had
been in so many ways relevant to their ongoing daily life, in particular,
their own sense of continuous busyness, and a difficult decision they have
to make. Sadly, this conversation is familiar to Jan and I. Usually it
comes after a baptism, wedding or funeral, where many in the
congregation are visitors.

Sometimes the surprise is based on other experience of a church that was
overly formal, often detached, and where they had felt spoken down to, or
narrowly chastised in some way. Sometimes it is purely about perception.
Church will, they expect, be boring, irrelevant and formal.

Any church, like any gathering of people, will be a mixed bag. We gather
as we are, sometimes in a good and meaningful place in our lives, and
sometimes on the edge of our reserves. We gather around the best and
worst news that we can hold and share as people, and everything is
potentially on the table. We build friendships, take risks, fail, and consider
how to live generously in every way.

We try to "keep it real" too. Jan and I are passionate about that.
Exploring faith and self and community from any place other than our lives
as they really are is a waste of time.

Maybe you haven't been for a while, maybe never. Maybe you or
someone you know needs a place to breathe out, hold the big things in life
with care and grace, ask tough questions and work through them, or just
meet some new people. If so, you know where we are.
