Dear Friends,

After nearly eleven years, I'll shortly be moving to take up a post as the minister to Haxby and Wigginton Methodist Church, and also working alongside a deacon in the city at Central Methodist Church. Both are exciting and challenging opportunities.

I came to live here in September 2006, and it has been an incredible privilege to do so. I have had personal lows and highs along the way, and grown enormously as a person and minister. I have walked alongside so many of you, in the best and worst of moments, and in our community's life. It has been a wonderful season, but the time has come to move on.

I've always written this letter very deliberately, wanting to include all of you as much as I could. Faith is lived out in everyday life, and we've all shared that, wherever faith fits in. Over the years many of you have told me that you appreciate my letters in general, or one of them in particular. I've also been told I write too much or too little (often simultaneously!) about this or that part of our life here.

We live in a complex and multi-faceted place, perhaps uniquely so in this city. That can be frustrating, even alienating at times for some, but in so many ways our corner of York is a dynamic, enquiring, diverse and fun place to be. I've had so many fascinating conversations with people from around the corner and around the world, and they have all been a gift to me, even and especially when there has been disagreement.

I will miss living here, and it will in some ways always feel like home.
