Hello,

With Rory now preparing to move to Haxby and Jan still recovering from illness, this month's letter has fallen to me - if you don't know me, I am the Anglican chaplain at the University, and an occasional presence at several local churches.

As I write, we are just taking in the news of a massive, deliberate attack on the NHS's computer system, along with others around the world. It affected a huge number of hospitals and surgeries, including in the York area. I'm not a technophobe, and I rely on my computer as much as anyone; but I've never understood the mindset of computer hacking. Hackers cause untold damage, inconvenience - and in the case of attacks on the NHS or national security systems, they even put lives at risk. It brings to mind a conversation I had recently with a professor at the University about whether there is a limit on research: just because we *can* do something, doesn't make it the *right* thing to do. Computer systems are not just abstract codes: we rely on them for everything. So to hack into a system from a long way away may prove that you're clever at writing code, but it also means that you don't have to face up to the effect you have on real lives.

Actions have consequences. Human life is not a computer game. On June 8th we will be asked to vote in a general election which will affect all of our lives. Politicians of all parties will appeal to our self-interest, to vote according to 'what's right for me and my family'. But although that's perfectly reasonable on one level, we also have a responsibility to think of the bigger picture - and especially if we are people of faith. How will my choice affect others who may have less power and less freedom? If I exercise my rights, does that limit someone else's?

'Because I can' isn't always enough. Use your vote, and use it well.
