Dear Friends,

November is a time of remembrance. In the Church calendar, November 1st is All Saints' Day, when we remember the heroes and heroines of our faith. Some then observe November 2nd as All Souls Day to remember all the faithful departed. I do not believe in first- and second-class citizens in the kingdom of heaven: in the New Testament itself all Christians are called saints (even if some are less saintly than others!), so I remember them all on 1st.

Then 12th is Remembrance Sunday, being the closest Sunday to Armistice Day on 11th. Last May, my wife and I went on a tour of WW2 Italian battlefields, so that she could visit her father's grave at Monte Cassino for the first time. My father had also been there (and got a broken nose when a mule kicked him in the face going up a hillside). He returned, or I would not be here. We visited ten war cemeteries in all, including the Polish and German cemeteries at Cassino, and the American cemetery near Anzio. Each had over a thousand graves, of mostly young men (we saw one grave of a 16-year-old.). The overwhelming feeling of our group was "What a waste of life!" I will be preaching on this at the 10am service on 12th.

I believe that some causes are worth fighting for. Hitler had to be stopped, and appeasement had failed. I am proud of what my father and his comrades did. It is right that we honour those who gave their lives in two world wars, and various conflicts since. Also it is important that we remember the enormous human cost of conflict, and rededicate ourselves to making peace. Apart from Remembrance ceremonies, at 10am on Saturday 18th, Fishergate, Fulford and Heslington Local History Society are launching their new booklet on the seven men of Heslington commemorated in the WW1 Memorial Window of Heslington Church (in Church, facing the window).

Finally, On Sunday December 3rd, at 6pm, there will be a memorial service in Church for those for whom the Church ministers performed funerals over last year, plus any other loved ones the congregation may wish to be mentioned by name.
