Dear Friends,

In February, the papers were full of dreadful stories about how some aid workers had misused their power and influence to abuse the very people in Haiti they were there to help. In response, some people cancelled their support for international development charities. Despite this, Christian Aid, with local staff standing alongside local partner organisations, has continued to provide urgently needed help to some of the poorest and most vulnerable Haitians.

We must help people like Marcelin, who struggles to raise his three daughters after losing his home and livelihood in hurricane Matthew. In recent years, Haiti endured some of the worst natural disasters on earth. Marcelin and his family are not just survivors; they are fighters. But they are only so strong. They won't be able to survive the next hurricane without our help.

Christian Aid unites people from all walks of life, to step out in mission for our

neighbours, like Marcelin. We believe in life before death, because we believe God's Kingdom is stronger than the storms.

This Christian Aid Week, 13-19 May, we can be good news to Marcelin and others like him. We can help them build a home that will weather the next storm, so they won't need to fight to survive anymore. Instead they might thrive.

During Christian Aid Week Heslington Church is organising the annual street collection. Can you help? If Heslington parish could raise £2100, it would pay to train 10 local builders in Haiti. These builders could then build secure, comfortable homes for people like Marcelin.

Together, we can be stronger than the storms and be good news to our poorest neighbours.
